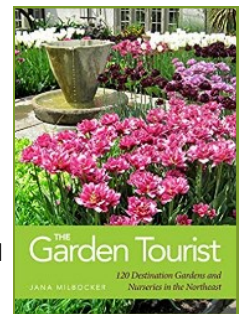
Braintree Reads Continues Author Talk: The Garden Tourist

A question-and-answer session will follow the program, and the author will sell and sign copies of her book.



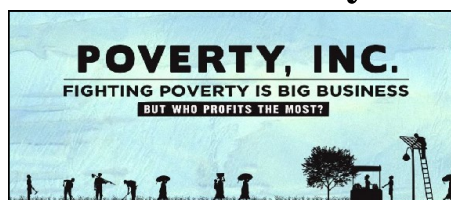
A Taste of Korea

education conferences around the world.

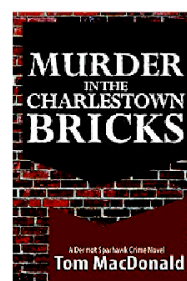
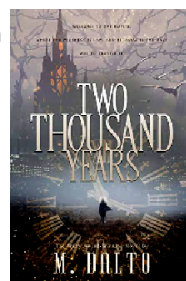
