

Topics for the Babysitter's Training program include child safety, first aid, emergency response, feeding, discipline, entertaining, state of child development, and the business of babysitting.


Meets on two Saturdays in May -- the 11th and the 18th -- from 1:30 to 4:30 PM in Logan Auditorium.
