

Kulina Folk Art Soap Making Workshop

Create your own special soap on **Saturday, November 16th from 11:00 Am to 1:00 PM in Logan Auditorium** in this Soap Making Workshop for adults and older teens (ages 16 and up). Limited to 40 participants. Advance registration is required.

Each participant will make their own soapy creations using white and clear glycerin soap and a variety of templates to create the shapes. The process does not involve traditional soap making techniques, so there is no lye exposure. Once the clear soap base has cooled slightly, we will add color, essential oil (optional), cosmetic grade glitter and a variety of shapes, such as hearts, stars bunnies and more. At the end of the workshop each participant will take home their handmade soap, it can be removed from the mold the following day and used right away. Soap is approximately 5.50 oz. and overall measurements of 4" x 4" x 3/4".

Join us on Wednesday, November 13th at 6:30 PM in Logan Auditorium for a screening of the newly-released on DVD movie, *Red Joan*.

Joan Stanley (Judi Dench) is a widow living out a quiet retirement in the suburbs when, shockingly, the British Secret Service places her under arrest. The charge: providing classified scientific information—including details on the building of the atomic bomb—to the Soviet government for decades. As she is interrogated, Joan relives the dramatic events that shaped her life and beliefs: her student days at Cambridge, where she excelled at physics while challenging deep-seated sexism; her tumultuous love affair with a dashing political radical (Tom Hughes); and the devastation of World War II, which inspired her to risk everything in pursuit of peace. Based on a sensational true story, *Red Joan* vividly brings to life the conflicts—

between patriotism and idealism, love and duty, courage and betrayal—of a woman who spent a lifetime being underestimated while quietly changing the course of history.
