

Join us **Tuesday, April 5th at 7:00 pm in Logan Auditorium** to learn more about Understanding Contemporary Poetry with Professor Gloria Monaghan of Wentworth University School of Science and Humanities. Prof. Monaghan will explain how to read contemporary poetry for meaning and understanding, sharing examples from her own work and that of other contemporary poets.

Gloria Monaghan is a Professor at Wentworth University in Boston at the School of Science and Humanities. She is the author of two chapbooks and

three books of poetry, including Flawed (Finishing Line Press, 2011), which was nominated for the Massachusetts Book Award, Her poems have appeared in *Blue Max Review, Adelaide, Aurorean, Chiron, Nixes-Mate, First Literary Review East, Aries,* among others. In 2018 her poem, "Into Grace" was nominated for the Pushcart Prize. She has also been nominated for the Griffin Prize.
