Meet John Adams, America's second president, at Thayer Public Library on **Saturday, October 25th at 2:00 pm in Logan Auditorium** in this program which is offered as part of the nation's 250th anniversary celebrations.

Dressed in clothes Adams wore as President 1797-1801, George Baker, as John Adams, will talk about life and his view of history and society in this engaging performance — **Meet John Adams – A lively and Revolutionary Conversation with America's Second President**. This program is free and open to all.

In 2008, George created a one-man show to represent the humor and patriotism of President John Adams. Since then, his performances have taken place across the United States at venues large and small.
