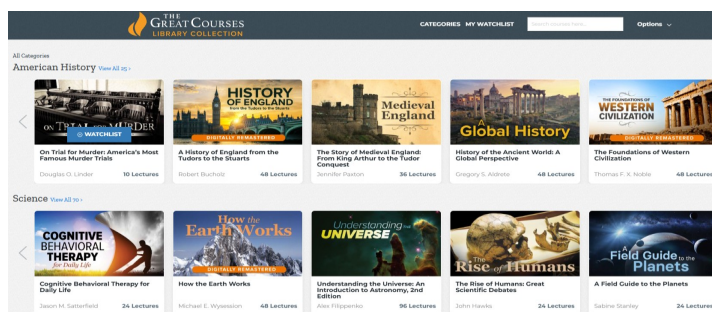

Learn about the Special Collections at the Allen County Public Library from Curt B. Witcher, Director of Special Collections and Manager of the library's Genealogy Center.

Family Tree Magazine says of the Allen County Public Library:

"The Allen County Public Library's Genealogy Center has garnered a national reputation and attracts more than 100,000 researchers from across the country each year. This Fort Wayne, Ind., library's claim to fame is the *Periodical Source Index*, which catalogs thousands of genealogical and historical periodicals published since 1800. Staff have collected more than 10,000 titles."

The Periodical Source Index (PERSI) is an index of articles on genealogy and local history, chiefly in the English language covering the United States and Canada, but including an increasing number of English and French sources from Britain, Ireland and Australia. Containing more than 2.5 million citations from thousands of periodical titles, PERSI provides in-depth coverage to over two centuries of research in North America and the British Isles.

Curt Witcher also serves as the curator of the library's Fine Book Collection. Curt is a former president of both the Federation of Genealogical Societies and the National Genealogical Society, and the founding president of the Indiana Genealogical Society.
